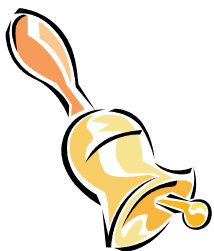

### NCEA

Information on the 2005 NCEA results has recently been released to the public. The 7 May 2006 Herald on Sunday contained an article entitled "Surprises on NCEA's report card". Wesley College was one of the schools highlighted with the comment: Wesley's NCEA pass rates ranged from 51.9 to 62.7, shunting the decile 2 school ahead of five decile 10 schools. Overall the pass rate is up 5.4 per cent on 2004.

## WESLEY GRANT 2007

### **2007 BOARDING FEES AND BUSINESS ARRANGEMENTS**

The Boarding Fees for 2007 have been set at 6,250.00 per year. The Trust Board will continue to subsidise the full cost of \$12,750.00 by \$6,500.00 to keep the fees at this level. Fees will be charged at \$1,562.00 per term. Fees may be paid in two ways:

1. As one payment made on the first day of each term. A discount of 2.5% will be made for a payment on the first day of the term. The payment required will be \$1523.45.
2. By a weekly or fortnightly automatic payment of \$130.00 per week / \$260.00 per fortnight. If this option is chosen the first payment must be made into the Wesley College account on or before Monday 8 January 2007.

### **WESLEY GRANTS**

The Boarding Fees may be reduced where families qualify for a Wesley Grant. Application Forms are now available and must be returned to the College by 18 September 2006. Please note that an application for a grant must be received each year. A Grant will not be made unless there is an application.

'Oku toe hoko atu pe hono totongi fakakakato 'e he Poate Talasiti 'a e \$6,500 ma'ae tokotaha kotoa pe, ke a'u ki he totongi totonu 'a e tokotaha ki he ta'u, 'a ia ko e \$12,750.00.

Ko e totongi ako 'i he 2007 ko e \$1,562.00 ki he teemi.

Ko e founga 'e ua 'oku lava 'o ngaue'aki ki he totongi ako:

1. Totongi faka'angataha 'a e \$1,523.45 ki he teemi. 'E holo'aki 'a e peseti 'e 2.5 kapau 'e totongi he 'uluaki 'aho 'o e teemi.
2. 'E lava ke totongi fakauike 'a e \$130.00 pe fakauike ua 'a e \$260.00 Kapau te ke fili ke ngaue'aki 'a e founga ko 'eni, kuo pau ke kamata 'a e 'uluaki totongi he 'aho Monite 8 'o Sanuali 2007, pe kimu'a ai.

1. Me saumi taucoko e na i matai ni siga ni dua na i wasewase ni vuli. Ke vakyacori oqo, e na rawa ni musuki sobu mai na i curucuru e 2.5 na pasede (2.5%). Na i curucuru ka namaki e na i matai ni siga e \$1523.45
2. E rawa tale ga ni vakayacori na saumi curucuru e na kena musuki tiko e na vei macawa e \$130.00 se \$260.00 e na vei macawa rua. Ke ko ni digitaka na i tuvatuva oqo, e dodonu me saumi taumada ki na Wesley College na i matai ni musumusu ni se bera na siga oqo: Monite 8 ni Januери, 2007.
