The season of Lent reminds us that the most important reason for us to be THANKFUL is - we believe in God who loves us no matter what ... who loves us unconditionally ... who loves us for who we are.

We GIVE THANKS to God for being able to see how important it is for us to know we are loved.

We're also reminded of Jesus' death. God understands we're only human and that we will get things wrong and stuff up, but the hope is that in and through what Jesus' death does for us, we will learn from our mistakes and move on. We GIVE THANKS to God for understanding this about us.

God promises to be with us always and is within each of us. We GIVE THANKS to God for knowing that we need someone looking out for us 24/7.

We GIVE THANKS for ways that make us strong and able to cope.
