The Bible Reading was from Proverbs 3:1-8 on pages and in the Wesley Bibles.

Tears of thankfulness. When I messaged him congratulating him on his awesome debut and said 'God is good' Karl messaged back '...all the time and please thank everyone at Wesley for their support. God bless.'

Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding. We don't have to make things any harder for ourselves than they already are. We can vision and plan with God. The promise, we will be blessed, blessing will come to us, blessing will find us, blessing will bring tears of thankfulness and great joy!
